What type of limestone is on Christmas Island?

How did Christmas Island form?

The two standard interpretations of formation are either due to hotspot formation (as with the Hawaiian islands) or creation through lava escaping through plate boundaries or other fractures. Christmas Island, however, doesn't fit into either of these scenarios.

When is Christmas Island celebrated?

Up until 1957, Christmas Island was administered in Singapore, a British colony at the time. This changed when Australia purchased the island for \$2.9m on 1 January 1958. As a result of this transaction, Territory Day is now celebrated annually on 1st October, and is met with great enthusiasm by all islanders.

Is Christmas Island a state?

The territory falls under no formal state jurisdiction, but the Western Australian government provides many services as established by the Christmas Island Act. The Australian government provides services through the Christmas Island Administration and the Department of Infrastructure and Regional Development.

Is Christmas Island a maritime hazard?

The narrow fringing reef surrounding the island poses a maritime hazard. Christmas Island lies 2,600 kilometres (1,600 mi) northwest of Perth, Western Australia, 350 km (220 mi) south of Indonesia, 975 km (606 mi) east-northeast of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, and 2,748 km (1,708 mi) west of Darwin, Northern Territory.

Why is Christmas Island so endemic?

First discovered in 1643, Christmas Island has a history of minimal human disturbance which paired with its geographic isolation has led to a high level of endemism among its flora and fauna. In fact, with so many endemic species, the island is often referred to as the 'Galapagos of the Indian Ocean'.
