

What makes up the power sector in South Sudan?

The power sector in South Sudan consists of a mix of public and private sector service providers that engage in electricity generation, transmission, and distribution enterprises. Encouragement is given for the development of electricity through renewable power sources, such as hydro, wind, biomass, solar, and geothermal.

Can South Sudan generate solar power?

South Sudan's rural electrification plans include large-scale solar thermal and small-scale solar photovoltaic power generation given its access to an average of more than 10 hours of sunshine per day year round, with radiation on the horizontal surface of about 5 - 6 kWh/m²/day.

Will South Sudan build electricity distribution networks?

South Sudan is building electricity distribution networks in the mentioned three cities. The administration of each project will be handed over to the South Sudanese side upon completion. The projects are still under implementation.

The government of South Sudan commissioned a new power plant and a \$38m upgraded power distribution system for Juba on 21 November. Local developer Ezra Construction & Development Group commissioned the 33MW first phase of a 100MW power plant due for completion by the end of 2021.

South Sudan's President, H.E. Salva Kiir, announced the launch of the first phase of the 100MW power plant project, which is expected to supply electricity to Juba and surrounding areas.
