Uruguay (/ˈjʊrˈɡwɑɪ / (i) YOOR-?-gwy, Spanish: [uruˈwaj](i)), officially the Oriental Republic of Uruguay (Spanish: República Oriental del Uruguay), is a country in South America.

In the rankings for June 2012, Uruguay was ranked the second best team in the world, according to the FIFA world rankings, their highest ever point in football history, falling short of the first spot to the Spain national football team. Are Uruguayans European?

Uruguayans are of predominantly European origin, with over 87.7% of the population claiming European descent in the 2011 census. Most Uruguayans of European ancestry are descendants of 19th and 20th century immigrants from Spain and Italy, and to a lesser degree Germany, France, and Britain.

Claimed by Argentina but annexed by Brazil in 1821, Uruguay declared its independence in 1825 and secured its freedom in 1828 after a three-year struggle. The administrations of President Jose BATLLE in the early 20th century launched widespread political, social, and economic reforms that established a statist tradition.
